Lopez Village Road Bioswale

San Juan County's Department of Environmental Stewardship is protecting the environment by improving storm water management in Lopez Village. The Lopez Village Road Bioswale Project along 1.5 blocks of Village Road will treat and convey storm water and improve parking and pedestrian access. The existing roadside ditch will be upgraded to a well-vegetated storm water swale to manage water.

What will result?

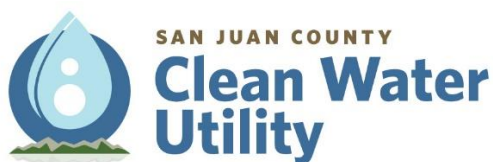
This project will:

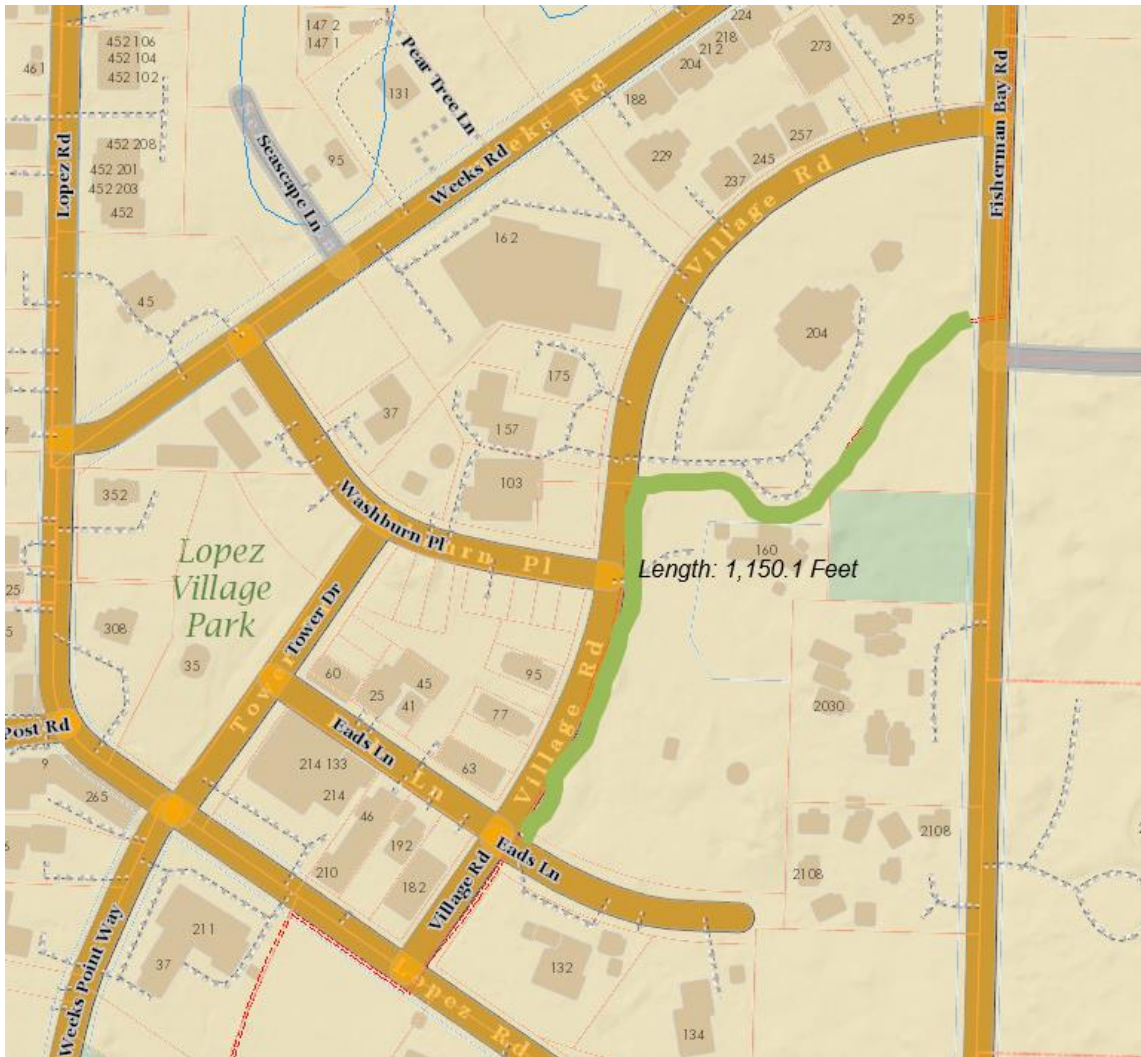
- Improve parking and provide a pedestrian trail along Village Rd
- Construct a vegetated swale planted with native plants used for stormwater treatment
- Provide habitat for birds and butterflies
- Clean road runoff to help protect Fisherman Bay
- Manage storm water flooding
- Provide an upgraded Farmers Market entryway and access bridges.

When will the project begin?

The project is scheduled to begin late September 2022 and be completed by early November 2022.

Project Area

The project is along Village Road between Eads Lane and the Children’s Center driveway. In addition, the drainage ditch between Village Rd and Fisherman Bay Rd will be maintained to align with the new project.
